Dr. Bruno Coppieters Professor Free University of Brussels, Belgium

Bruno Coppieters is Professor of Political Science at the Vrije Universiteit Brussel (Free University of Brussels). He holds a PhD in Philosophy from the Freie Universitaet Berlin and teaches courses on the history of political thought, conflict resolution and the ethics of war and secession. His published works deal mainly with federalism and conflicts on sovereignty in the Caucasus and the Balkans. He has co-edited the following books: Statehood and Security: Georgia After the Rose Revolution, Cambridge/Mass., MIT Press, 2005 and _Contextualizing Secession: Normative Studies in Comparative Perspective, Oxford, Oxford University Press, 2003.

Abstract

The model of a centre-periphery relationship aims at providing a better understanding for the dynamic processes taking place as a consequence of the spatial partitioning by borders.[1] The present paper assumes that this model is particularly well suited to analyze the domestic and international dimensions of conflicts on sovereignty, including the one on the status of Taiwan. Furthermore, it permits us to engage in an analysis of future policy options, particularly those of the European Union.
