Abstract: The geopolitics of East Asia has been experiencing significant changes in recent years with China's rise, America's return, Japan's drifting, and tensions on the Korean Peninsula, and intensified maritime territorial disputes. Many critical questions are waiting to be answered: What is the nature and ramification of the U.S. return to East Asia? Will China and the United States plunge into a direct conflict? Can China and Japan handle their fragile relationship? How can the flash points in the region such as South China Sea, Diaoyu/Senkaku Islands, Northern Territories, and Dokdo/Takeshima be managed peacefully? Will the result of Taiwan's presidential election disrupt the peaceful development across the Taiwan Straits? We assembled a group of distinguished scholars and experts from Japan, South Korea, China and Taiwan to address these important issues.
