

# CURRENT CROSS-TAIWAN STRAIT AND NORTH-SOUTH KOREAN INTERACTIONS: A COMPARATIVE STUDY

## Abstract

During the post-Cold War era, owing to historical trauma, lacking of mutual trust, strife for national survival, the legacy of Cold War still hovers over the Taiwan Strait, Korean peninsula and their adjacent places. It is uncertain whether if military clashes can be avoided when those parties concerned are to pursue their national goals of unification, particularly for China and North Korea.

The author tries to probe, within a newly transformed environment, what the patterns of the relations in between China and Taiwan look like on the one hand, and what North and South Korea is on the other. The author believes that through a careful comparative study, the democratic Taiwan and South Korea could be better prepared to an ever-changing environment filled up challenges
